1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of certain resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting for (i) the re-election of the retiring Directors; (ii) the granting to the Directors of the Share Repurchase Mandate and the Issuance Mandate to repurchase Shares and to issue new Shares respectively; and (iii) the notice of the Annual General Meeting.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

2. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

In accordance with Article 84 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Sze Wai Pan, Mr. Wang Lei and Dr. Lau Ching Kwong shall retire at the Annual General Meeting. All of the above retiring Directors, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Dr. Lau Ching Kwong, being independent non-executive Director eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting, have made confirmations of independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. Further, the Company is of the view that Dr. Lau Ching Kwong meets the independence guidelines set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and is independent in accordance with the terms of the guidelines.

Biographical and other details of the above retiring Directors are set out in Appendix I to this circular. At the Annual General Meeting, separate ordinary resolutions will be proposed to approve their re-election.

3. PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATES TO REPURCHASE AND ISSUE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 1 June 2018, general unconditional mandates were granted to the Directors to repurchase and issue Shares respectively. Such mandates will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. POSITION, EXPERIENCE AND LENGTH OF SERVICE

(1) Mr. Sze Wai Pan

Mr. Sze Wai Pan (“Mr. Sze”), aged 53, is the founder of our Group and one of our executive directors. He is the Chairman, chief executive officer, chief engineer and a member of the nomination committee of the Company. He is responsible for overall research and development activities, overall corporate strategies planning and business development of the Group. He is a director of all our major PRC operating subsidiaries of our Group. Mr. Sze obtained a master’s degree in science (with distinction) from The University of Warwick, the United Kingdom in July 1991, and a master’s degree in arts from the City Polytechnic of Hong Kong (currently known as City University of Hong Kong) in December 1994. He has been a member of Nanjing Political Consultative Conference (南京市政治協商會議) since January 2008. Mr. Sze received a Nanjing Science and Technology Achievement Award (南京市科技功臣獎) from the Nanjing Municipal Government in May 2009 in recognition of his achievement in the APM industry and was nominated for the Young to Middle-aged Expert with Outstanding Contributions in Jiangsu Province for 2012 (2012江蘇省有突出貢獻中青年專家) from the Nanjing Municipal Bureau of Human Resources and Social Security (南京市人力資源和社會保障局) in February 2013. Further, Mr. Sze is an inventor of all our 148 registered patents and an inventor of our Hot-in-Place technology. Mr. Sze has over 20 years of experience in engineering, overall corporate strategies, planning and business development of our Group.

(2) Mr. Wang Lei

Mr. Wang Lei (“Mr. Wang”), aged 42, was appointed as a non-executive director of the Company in December 2013. He has been with CICC Jia Cheng Investment Management Co. Ltd. (中金佳成投資管理有限公司), a wholly-owned subsidiary of China International Capital Corporation Limited (中國國際金融股份有限公司), since 2009 and is now an executive director. He obtained a master’s degree in business administration in 2005 from Saïd Business School, University of Oxford. Mr. Wang has over 12 years of experience in investment banking and private equity.

(3) Dr. Lau Ching Kwong

Dr. Lau Ching Kwong (“Dr. Lau”), aged 76, joined in August 2012 as an independent non-executive director of the Company. Under the renewal contract, Mr. Wang will not receive a salary or fee from the Company in connection with his position as a Director.

(3) Dr. Lau Ching Kwong

Dr. Lau has entered into a service contract with the Company for a term of two years effective from 26 June 2013. Dr. Lau has entered into a renewal contract with the Company on 26 June 2015, 26 June 2017 for a term of two years each, and is subject to termination by either party giving not less than three months' written notice. Under the renewal contract, Dr. Lau is entitled to an annual emolument of HK\$200,000. The emolument excludes bonus and other benefits, which may be granted at the discretion of the Company. The Director's fees and other emoluments are determined by the Board with reference to his duties, responsibilities and performance as well as the market rate of a director of other Hong Kong listed companies.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

Subject to the passing of Ordinary Resolution 4 of the notice of the Annual General Meeting in respect of the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that the total number of issued Shares of the Company remains unchanged as at the date of the Annual General Meeting, i.e. being 1,079,000,000 Shares, the Directors would be authorised under the Share Repurchase Mandate to repurchase, during the period in which the Share Repurchase Mandate remains in force, up to 107,900,000 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of the Annual General Meeting.

2. REASONS FOR SHARE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders.

Repurchases of Shares may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

6. UNDERTAKING

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best knowledge and belief of the Company, (i) Freetech Technology Limited ("Freetech", which is solely owned by Mr. Sze Wai Pan ("Mr. Sze"), the chairman, executive Director and chief executive officer) holds 529,625,260 Shares, representing approximately 49.08% of the total issued Shares; (ii) Intelligent Executive, which is solely owned by Ms. Sze Wan Nga ("Ms. Sze"), an executive Director) holds 29,640,000 Shares and Ms. Sze holds 100,000 Shares held under equity derivatives, together representing approximately 2.76% of the total issued Shares; (iii) Smart Executive Group Limited ("Smart Executive", which is solely owned by Ms. Sze On Na) holds 50,720,520 Shares, representing approximately 4.70% of the total issued Shares; and (iv) Smart Vision Partner Limited ("Smart Vision", which is solely owned by Mr. Sze Wai Pang) holds 23,888,000 Shares, representing approximately 2.21% of the total issued Shares. As Ms. Sze and Ms. Sze On Na are the sisters of Mr. Sze and Mr. Sze Wai Pang is the brother of Mr. Sze, all of them had been treated as parties acting in concert (as defined under the Takeovers Code) and were deemed to be a group of controlling shareholders of the Company. The aggregate number of Shares held by Freetech, Intelligent Executive and Ms. Sze, Smart Executive and Smart Vision represent approximately 58.75% of the total number of issued Shares.
